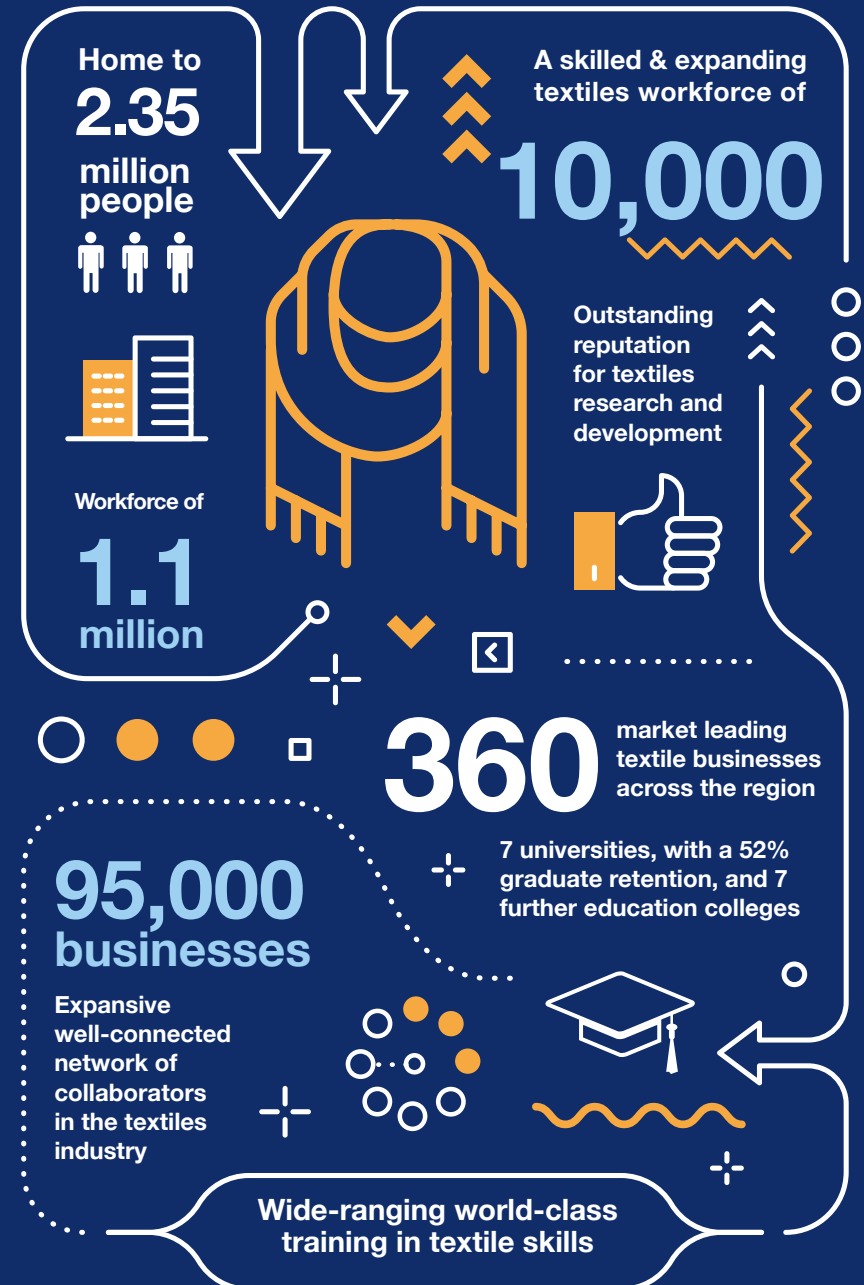

Part of West Yorkshire, Kirklees is strategically located at the heart of the UK and the centre of the Leeds, Manchester and Sheffield City Region triangle - a pivotal central location within the UK's £339billion northern powerhouse.

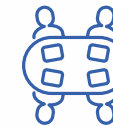

Innovation

Kirklees first developed a worldwide reputation for cloth manufacture in the 1700s, and we've remained at the forefront of this industry by maintaining an innovative approach to textiles to this day.

Kirklees has built on that history as knowledge is passed down through generations, and blended that internationally recognised expertise with the latest ideas and technologies. We are a leading force for innovation in the UK textiles sector which is ranked #1 in Europe for patents.

Excellence in every field

Our local businesses work across natural, synthetic and composite fibres with a vast range of focuses. This includes knitting, spinning and weaving, all the way through to processes like polymerisation, nanotechnology and automation.

As a result, we have businesses excelling in every aspect of the textile industry – from fashion to health and safety, from medical equipment to agriculture, from building materials to use in digital technologies.

Research and development

We have an outstanding reputation for world-class expertise in textiles-related research and development. The **University of Huddersfield's Technical Textiles Research Centre**, the **Textiles Centre of Excellence** and the **Society of Dyers and Colourists** work with local businesses to shape this industry's future.

We are home to the **3M Buckley Innovation Centre** and **Kirklees College's Process Manufacturing Centre**, and we have close links with the **University of Leeds' Centre for Immersive Technologies**, the **Future Fashion Factory**, **Leeds Institute of Textiles & Colour**, and the **National Physical Laboratory**.



Green manufacturing

From the early 19th century, with the emergence of the shoddy and mungo industries, Batley and Dewsbury were hubs for recycling waste fibres into useful fabrics. Local businesses continue to lead the way in sustainable practices, blending centuries of knowledge with the latest technologies.

We lead the way with international initiatives such as **World Circular Textiles Day** and **Textiles 2030**, which are harnessing industry leaders' expertise to help the UK's textile industry become more of a circular economy.

In 2023, we were proud to host the **Textile Institute World Conference**, which focused on the transition to zero carbon and zero waste in the textile industry.

Our local businesses are at the forefront of responsible design and production, including greening, sorting, recycling and reusing. Sustainability, digitisation and future fashion are high on the agenda, from education through to industry.

Skilled workforce

Kirklees is part of the largest higher education cluster outside of London, with a workforce of experts in future design and production of high-quality materials.



Seven universities, including the University of Huddersfield, produce world-class research and 34,000 skilled graduates every year.

The University of Huddersfield offers nine degrees involving textiles, all based in a state-of-the-art £30million facility, as well as work placements and entrepreneurial support via Enterprise Placement Years.

Local skills programmes have also created thousands of new apprenticeships, enabling thousands more young people to enter employment, education or training.

Kirklees College is one of the leading apprenticeship providers in the UK, offering 30 courses which train more than 1,000 apprentices each year. The Textiles Centre of Excellence is the largest provider of fashion and textiles apprenticeships in the UK and provides flexible training at all levels – from pre-entry to foundation degree equivalent programmes – with an eye on the future skills needs of the fashion and textile manufacturing sector.

We have a wealth of collaborative partnerships, including through the Woven festival, the Society of Dyers & Colourists, the UK Fashion & Textiles Association, the Leeds Institute of Textiles & Colour, and the Manchester Textiles Institute. Thanks to these partnerships, those developing industry skills in Kirklees have easy access to opportunities at other organisations and esteemed textile academic centres across the north of England.
